POCKLINGTON Runners were out in force once again on Tuesday evening to defend their York & District Road Race title success of 2008. Pocklington started the first 10k race in the series of six with a record field of two hundred and forty five runners, with forty of them being Pocklington Runners!

Pocklington's fastest member of the club at present, Tom Danby, ran a very creditable second place on the night in a time of 34:14, only seconds behind the winner Cameron Brooks from York Knavesmire Harriers.

Denis Speck kept the opposition at bay claiming fourth place overall with 34:47 and Paul Tatterton ran an excellent 37:17. Richard Ginn gained a PB for the distance with 38:16 and Stephen Wood put in an excellent effort in 38:29.

Warwick Anderson is getting back after a good London Marathon with 39:41 and Jim Holding had a solid run in 40:16.

Alison Thornton was first lady back for Pocklington with an excellent time of 44:52 closely followed by Rachael Houseman in 45:06.
